## Primary Lessons

### Different Lives Lesson Plan

Gr. 3-5

Students learn to empathize with elephants while learning the differences between African and Asian elephants and comparing elephant lives in the wild versus captive elephants used for the tourist industry. <link>

### Elephants Matter Too Lesson Plan

Gr. 3-6

Students learn to recognize similar characteristics between humans and elephants while identifying emotions that humans and elephants have in common. <link>

### Are Elephants Colour Blind?

Ages 8-11

Students explore whether or not elephants are colorblind <link>

#### Materials Links:

- Link that gives an example of a person who is red/green color deficient (deuteranopia). Elephants are dichromic in daylight and would see the world similarly: <link>

## Secondary Lessons

### Drawing a Line Lesson Plan

Gr. 8-12

Students create concept maps and explain the ivory trade while contemplating multiple views on a controversial issue <link>

#### Materials Links:
