Fundraising Strategies for Elephant Conservation

1. Obesign & Sell Awareness Merchandise

- Through organizations like **Born Free Foundation**, classes can "adopt" an elephant.

4. 🮭 Host a Conservation Showcase or Talent Night

- Students perform elephant-themed skits, songs, poetry, or dances.

7. Social Media Challenge

- Launch a TikTok, Instagram, or YouTube challenge:
 - Ex: "Dress Like an Elephant for a Day" or "Trunk Talk Challenge" where students share facts in fun ways.
- Include donation links and educational facts in captions.
- Use a hashtag like #TrunksOfHope or #StandWithElephants.
