"Super-Plants" You can print these three images and use them as your "Super-Plant" cards during the **Elaborate** section (Step 3) of your lesson.

1. Common Milkweed (*Asclepias syriaca*)

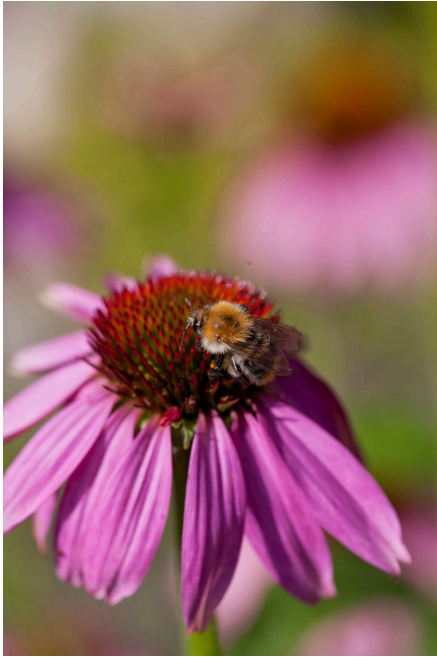
This is the ultimate "Super-Plant" because it is the **only food source** for the Monarch butterfly caterpillar.

2. Purple Coneflower (*Echinacea purpurea*)

This is a versatile "Super-Plant" widely native across Eastern and Central North America. It provides excellent **nectar for bees and butterflies** and its seeds feed birds in the fall.

3. Goldenrod (Solidago)

This "Super-Plant" is crucial because it blooms late in the season, providing a final, vital source of **nectar for bees and migrating Monarchs** before winter. It is native to most of North America.
